Pastor's Reflection

Deepening Our Faith

I think you will love this edition of the Visitor with all the fantastic pics over our Christmas Season. We decided to use them all to really highlight the fantastic events we had to celebrate the gift of Christ. In the afterglow of the Christmas season let us step into our new year and really take on deepening our faith as individuals, families, and a congregation.

Is it fair to say that Christian Lite has become a thing? Can we start to move the dial back in the other direction? This is not just the topic of this article but will be the focus of 2023 and the subject matter of our Lenten Services, "Deepening our Faith Together".

The first question would have to be why deepen our faith? Like most things, one gets more proficient by practice and we can always improve. Deepening your faith provides the ability to not only stay strong in times of trouble but to generate an environment that reflects your faith. You bring the peace into your household and into your workplace. In faith, when all those around you see despair, you have eyes to see what they cannot, *hope*! That is because you know there is always a way in Christ! When people speak the language of disdain, you speak the language of grace, humility, compassion; you speak the language that brings light, hope, and love.

A deep faith makes a huge impact in our daily life and that transfers to all those that are dear to us. Who do you admire, seek guidance from, look up to as an example to follow? Did they stay calm in a bad situation? Did they reflect light and love? Were they strong when they needed to be? Did they never stop loving you? Behind all these gifts was a faith developed over their lifetime.

Hopefully the 'why deepen our faith' question has been answered and is clear and compelling. The next question would have to be 'how do we deepen our faith?' That is too big of a question for this article but will be the topic of our Lenten Services through all the Wednesdays in March. It will be the question and commitment of our entire year of 2023. Christian Lite may be very accommodating to our schedules and our lifestyle but it will not provide the peace that comes from living our faith.

I invite all our members to deepen their faith, take an important step by committing to being at Sunday worship every Sunday, make your schedule and other commitments bend to your commitment to keep the sabbath holy and you will send a strong message that God comes first. That act alone will deepen your faith exponentially. Commit to Ash Wednesday, the Lenten Services, and Good Friday. For too long I have failed to stress the importance of these overlooked services. On Ash Wednesday we start the journey with Christ to the Cross, we take account of our own sinfulness, we place ashes on our forehead as a symbol of solidarity and walk with Christ, it is a solemn service essential to our faith and

understanding of Christ' sacrifice. The Lenten Services are all designed to reveal our humanness to make room for God. Good Friday is the darkest service of the year, the lights go out in the sanctuary and the Christ candle is snuffed out as we mourn the death of Christ. After all, how can we celebrate Easter if we do not mourn his death?

I can imagine this does not sound like one small step and it is not, but it is a very important step with many more to follow along the journey together. Christian Lite has become a thing for all of us to one extent or another. Let us all deepen our faith together!

Words to live by,

these are the promises that parents, godparents, and congregation say to God when we baptize a child.

Will you encourage this child to renounce the power of evil and to receive the freedom of new life in Christ?

Will you teach this child that they may be led to profess Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior?

Do you promise, by the grace of God, to follow in the way of our Savior, to resist oppression and evil, to show love and justice, and to witness to the work and word of Jesus Christ as best you are able?

So you promise, according to the grace given you, to grow with this child in the Christian faith, to help him to be a faithful member of the church of Jesus Christ, by celebrating Christ's presence by furthering Christ mission in all the world, and by offering the nurture of the Christian church so that he may affirm his baptism?

Jesus Christ calls us to make disciples of all nations and to offer them the gift of grace in baptism. Do you, who witness and celebrate this sacrament, promise your love, support, and care to the child about to be baptized, as he lives and grows in Christ?

We promise our love, support, and care.

It is time to call out Christian Lite for what it is. A collective failure to keep our promises to God. The distinction between being Christian and Christian Lite must be made clear for the sake of our children. There is living true to our faith which provides us such a wonderful foundation for our life and gives so much joy as we share the love Christ puts in our heart and then there is Christian Lite. We know the difference. Let us all collectively turn away from Christian Lite and move into the deep powerful faith God is calling us into.
