# Pastor's Reflection

# **Continued Deepening Our Faith Together**

Deepening our Faith Together is the focus for our Wednesday night Lenten Services. One of the renowned theologians from Germany got us started this past Wednesday.

"Friedrich Schleiermacher, in full Friedrich Daniel Ernst Schleiermacher, (born November 21, 1768, Breslau, Silesia—died February 12, 1834, Berlin), German theologian, preacher, and classical philologist, generally recognized as the **founder of modern Protestant theology.** Schleiermacher says that feeling of absolute dependence on God is the highest grade of immediate self-consciousness, and is also an essential element of human nature (26)."

I can remember studying Schleiermacher in seminary. He was one of my favorites. The focus of the first Lenten service was our absolute dependance on God. I would add also our absolute dependance on one another, specifically as the body of Christ.

In our world today idealized notions of self-reliance has taken root to the detriment of society and individuals. We have been fed a steady diet of strong independent hero types going back to the 1950's. The lone cowboy image, the stand-out soldier. No one better captured the image than John Wayne in the countless cowboy and war movies. Today's hero figures are both men and women and their hyped-up abilities go far beyond anything John Wayne could have dreamed. They are always the strong silent type. They go it alone. Outside the box office you have legendary music stars like Frank Sinatra singing "I Did It My Way". Again, romanticizing the motion that we should be independent from one another and able to do it our way.

In a perfect one-two punch the next attack was on organizations. The government becomes the Man! Religion becomes "the opiate of the masses". Organization that came into existence with the purpose to make a difference in the world, such as the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Rotary, Masons, Shriners, VFW... the list goes on and on, are all grossly under supported because we are not a society of joiners. We have become a society that politely declines the offer to make a difference by joining an organization. Number one reason given is that we just do not have time. The real reason is we are just not into organizations. This is a far cry from Friedrich Schlieiermacher's fundamental understanding of our absolute dependance on God. If one gets real about God what is soon to follow is getting real with our dependance on one another.

This past Wednesday at the first of the Lenten Serious we broke down this false narrative that ultimately cuts us off from God and one another. This fundamentally flawed premise is the cause of our children, youth and adults having such high anxiety. We send messages to our children that they should be like the super heroes portrayed on the big screen, on the sports fields, the cool kids at school, and that is simply not possible. The flip side of unrealistic independence is not needy kids but generous and strong kids, grounded in the truth that we all matter, we are all needed and none of us have all the answers. In the focus of building a stronger and deeper faith together this becomes critical. The lie of independence removes us from the need for God and one another. It is in our absolute dependance on God that our faith grows. I am looking forward to the rest of our Lenten Season and being with all of you! Thank you all for your generous spirit and your dedication to your faith!
