

What is your only comfort in life and death?

Great question right! The answer can be found in the Heildelberg Catechism



The Heidelberg Catechism (1563).

"Heidelberg Catechism, Reformed confession of the <u>Christian faith</u> that is used by many of the <u>Reformed churches</u>. It was written in 1562 primarily by Caspar Olevianus, the superintendent of the <u>Palatinate</u> church, and Zacharias Ursinus, a professor of the theological <u>faculty</u> of the <u>University of Heidelberg</u>. It was accepted at the annual synod of the <u>Palatinate</u> church in 1563."

Lord's Day 1

h1. Q. What is your only comfort in life and death?

A. That I am not my own, but belong with body and soul, both in life and in death, to my faithful Saviour Jesus Christ.

He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has set me free from all the power of the devil.

He also preserves me in such a way that without the will of my heavenly Father not a hair can fall from my head; indeed, all things must work together for my salvation. Therefore, by his Holy Spirit he also assures me of eternal life and makes me heartily willing and ready from now on to live for him. 10

Is this statement still relevant in our world that is so secularized? If you asked the question today "What is your only comfort in life and death?" I think people would say, my family, friends, some would even say their pets. Although we do find comfort in family, friends and even our pets it will never serve ultimately. I love the line "That I am not my own, but belong with body and soul, both in life and in death, to my faithful Saviour Jesus Christ." The message is so powerful that if we are to have peace, power, security and love, we must

surrender completely to our Lord. When we attempt to find our comfort in our relationships, we drain the relationship dry. If your career or passions in life become your source they will also dry up. Nothing short of nurturing your relationship with your creator will give you the joy and ability to bring life into all your relationships. The love in your heart that you share comes from God. As you hold your child, especially when they are falling asleep, you experience the love God. You then share that love with your child. It is a wonderful cycle. God gives love, you share the love, the love is received, and in the acknowledgment and appreciation of God the love completes the cycle. However, if you take God out of the cycle, the love is eventually lost. 8 years ago, I was an adult chaperon at "Winter Weekend", a youth retreat at Camp DuBois. The focus for the weekend was to teach the teens to unplug from all their life stresses. Including their cell phones and computers. In talking with the youth, a clear pattern emerged. They were indeed needing to unplug and had no idea how to do that. They used words like anxiety to describe their life. It was not for a few years later that I read that teen and preteen suicide rate was up significantly from 2009 to 2019. The youth live in a culture that sees God as an obscure notion from past generations and look for their security in their friends and family. They look to the culture to find validation and the new cycle is one of anxiety and insecurity. Let us bring our youth and culture back into the living in faith. It is our job to teach the wisdom of this nearly 500-year-old Catechism.

What is your only comfort in life and death?

That I am not my own, but belong with body and soul, both in life and in death, to my faithful Saviour Jesus Christ.

We either belong heart and soul to God or we are living a lie. I can remember my children in their teens from time to time needing to have a "Coming to Jesus" conversation. They thought they had arrived into adulthood; they would decide how late they stayed out or how and when they would do their chores. That way of thinking insured a very clear conversation regarding reality and their place in it. Likely I am not the only parent that has had to have a coming to Jesus Conversation with their teens or preteens. We need a coming to Jesus Conversation in our culture. People need to come to reality that they do not breathe, grow, heal, have food to eat, strength in their bodies, give birth, hold a child, love a mother and father, without it first being given to them by God. We, in short, do not exist without God making it so. Strangely this simple but powerful fact is the source of our peace, comfort and security. We are never adrift in the seas of the culture but grounded and rooted in the Truth. That Truth becomes our walk with God.

• REVIEW/APPROVE MINUTES FROM THE JUNE 26, 2023 MEETING

The minutes from the June 26, 2023 meeting were reviewed. There being no additions or corrections, a motion was made by Amy Rohlfing to accept the minutes and Cheri Langsdorf seconded the motion. Motion carried.

REVIEW/APPROVE TREASURER'S REPORT/BILLS/TIME CARD/PASTOR'S EXPENSES

The treasurer's report/bills/time card and Pastor's expenses were presented and reviewed. There being no additions or corrections, Cheri Langsdorf made a motion to approve the reports and Sandy Tutka seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor informed the council he will be taking the weekend of Sept. 22-24 off. He has not yet found a replacement.

Pastor reminded the council to continue to promote St. John's Day. A fun day is planned for all involved at the Civic Park. It will be held after church on Sept. 17, 2023. During church service that same day, the new members will be installed. At this time Pastor has 8-9 people that will be joining.

Pastor has met with the parents of the children who will be in confirmation this year. The 7th graders, will attend confirmation from Sept.-May for 2 years. The 8th graders, will attend 1 year of confirmation, but will get some extra Saturdays to make up the difference. Confirmation classes will be held on Wednesday from 7-8:30pm. On Sunday, the confirmands will be asked to attend Sunday school at 9:40am followed by church service. Cheryl Prange has agreed to help Pastor with the confirmation classes.

GLENN/LINDA COATS BUILDINGS

A letter was given to the Coats' approximately two months ago outlining the responsibility/liability of the buildings that are on church property but are being used by the Coats'. Mark Rey will check with Attorney Mary Buettner on the next steps to be taken.

COMMITTEE FOR EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

Discussion was held regarding CPR training, emergency evacuation plan and other situations which may arise during any state of emergency. The committee made up of Cheri Langsdorf, Lisa Schwarze and Drew Watts will keep working on the proper way to be trained and what training is really needed, and who would do the training.

NEW BUSINESS

Pastor informed the council that the insurance company the church currently uses will be changing providers. A new quote should be given to Pastor by the end of August.

Another company is currently making a presentation to Valmeyer School. More details are to follow on this subject.

MAPLE TREE

There Is a large maple tree on the north side of the church hall that is dying and needs to be cut down. The council agreed that it should come down. Mark Rey and Drew Watts will make several connections with some people about cutting the tree down and removing the debris.

• LP GAS CONTRACT

The council agreed to sign the contract and have the LP gas delivered by FS at the cost of \$1.74/gal.

• 5th SUNDAY OFFERING IN OCTOBER

Cheri Langsdorf will contact the Dickerson family of old Valmeyer who have a 5yr old son battling leukemia. A motion was made by Lisa Schwarze and seconded by Fay Ross for these plans to proceed.

• A/C REPAIR BILL

A motion was made by Cheri Langsdorf and seconded by Amy Rohlfing to pay \$85.55 to Nathan Keller for the fan blade to repair the church air conditioner. No labor was charged.

A motion was made by Cheri Langsdorf and seconded by Lisa Schwarze to adjourn the meeting. Pastor led us in the Lord's Prayer to close the meeting at 7:30pm.
