Pastor's Reflection

Building the Church! A Vision on The Eve of Easter

A strong family quickly sees that to truly provide a great future for their children they must look beyond their own household. You want a world for your children to grow up in that provides opportunity for life enriching experiences such as 4-H, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, county fairs and good schools. You also want to create a world that provides necessities such as hospitals, colleges, local, state and national governance, a justice system, and the list goes on. Adding to that, today we need to look broader yet because the distinction neighbor has changed in recent decades. The challenges of the world are no longer just something happening “over there”. If we are to prepare our children to be successful in the future, we will need to teach them from our values at home and with a global perspective. We have more than a few of our members that see the world close up. Their careers take them to Europe, Africa, and South America just to name a few. We have members that teach or work in colleges that reach people from all over the world, and many of you have traveled far and wide. The scope of a family today is everything from 4-H to global challenges. Our wonderful families already participate in so many community building activities including being active in their church. The church is a strong partner in the development of their children and a partner in shaping the world their children will inherit. Let's look together how we are to build **The Church**.

In the history of the Church, we can track most of our celebrated achievements as a society back to the church from the founders of our great country to the school system and colleges where we send our children, along with countless organizations that came forth from the church. We stand on solid ground to ask the question, “What are we building?” We must ask the big questions if we are to prepare our children. They will certainly have to navigate being citizens of the world, and what a better place to learn than from the security of their homes and church.

For the last 12 years we have been sending graduating confirmation classes and youth to the Heifer Ranch in Little Rock, Arkansas. We make this voyage about every other confirmation class and are due to go again soon. The youth participate in an experience called the Global Village. They spend the first night in a barn with the group and spend a day learning about the life conditions and challenges the rest of the world faces day in and day out. On the following day and night the youth are divided into different villages that are made to simulate different parts and conditions in the world. One is a refugee camp, another a hut made of mud bricks and another a home similar to one in Ecuador. They are given food rations and challenges to face. To meet their basic needs, they have to trade goods with the other villages. Needless to say, the Global Village experience gives them a much deeper understanding of the world they live in. In many different ways our Sunday School program has taught the children to care for neighbors far away and close to home. Our VBS have often had a mission aspect to their program. When we look to build our church, we stand on a great history of doing the work. What comes next will come forth from the leaders that will step up to lead our Youth Program. The future of our Sunday School is in the very capable hands of Michelle and her crew, and our adult mission program is led by our beloved Laurie and her team. In past

years we have sent mission teams three times to Ecuador, and to Puerto Rico in 2019 . We sent a team to Greensburg, Kansas, Joplin Missouri, and Carbondale IL to help clean up and rebuild after tornados. We are no stranger to mission work.

All the many programs and organizations of the church work together towards the same end to build a community that takes care of one another and our neighbors near and far. The choir that lifts us up to worship on Sunday morning is as critical to mission work as the Women’s Fellowship at the heart of the church. What programs and mission work come next is for us to imagine and then to make it happen. I am continually inspired by the work of our church and vast ability of our members. Our children learn best by watching us make a difference in the world.

On the Eve of Easter let us dare to dream and respond to God’s call! Let us continue building Christ’s Church!

St. John's UCC Church Council Minutes - February 8, 2021

President Charlie Eckerty called the meeting to order. Those attending through zoom were Susie Brinkmann, Shirley Stafford, Sandy Tutka, Christy Muertz, Adam Tyberendt, Scott Johnson, Linda Schmidt and Pastor Poole. Pastor opened with a prayer.

Due to the covid restrictions our annual meeting was not held in person. Instead a letter was mailed to members showing names of individuals to be elected to their respective positions within the church. A postcard to be returned was enclosed for everyone to do their voting for or against the list of candidates. A total number of 43 cards was returned representing 71 members. All votes agreed with the selection.

Organizational Meeting:

Adam Tyberendt made the motion to elect Charlie Eckerty as President, seconded by Shirley Stafford and the motion carried.

Christy Muertz made the motion to elect Adam Tyberendt as Vice President, seconded by Scott Johnson and the motion carried.

Christy Muertz made the motion to elect Linda Schmidt as Secretary, seconded by Shirley Stafford and the motion carried.

January 4th Meeting Minutes:

- Scott Johnson made a motion to accept the minutes and Christy Muertz seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Treasurer's Report: After reviewing the report, Adam Tyberendt made a motion to accept the report as presented. Susie Brinkmann seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Bills/Timecard: Christy Muertz made a motion to accept the bills and timecard as presented. Scott Johnson seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Pastor's Expenses: Adam Tyberendt made a motion to accept the expenses presented. Shirley Stafford seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Pastor's Report: The annual Hike and Bike event to be held May 8th will be done Virtual again this year. More details to follow.
- Michelle Vogt is planning Vacation Bible School this summer.
- Jennifer Johnson is doing a great job as the administrative assistant. She is currently updating the church directory.
- Permission was given to Pastor Poole to pursue painting the hall basement floor once weather permits and temperatures warm up.

OLD BUSINESS

The new microphones for the church have been ordered and will be installed shortly. This will include a speaker in the Little Sunday School building.

NEW BUSINESS

- Inside church services will begin Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021 at 7:00 PM. The maximum attendance will be 50. Masks are required. The first Sunday service will be February 21, 2021 at 10 AM. No one will be turned away from this service. If we have more than 50 we will discuss the possibility of signing up for the services by calling Jennifer at the church office or with Signup Genius. We will be practicing social distancing and the ushers will seat you and release you. The recommended way is to fill the church from the front to the back and exit the church in the same manner. If you do not feel comfortable attending, the recorded services will continue.
- Lenten midweek services will be a recorded Joint Venture with the neighboring churches.
- Easter Sunday Sunrise Service will be held April 4th. The normal service will be at 10AM. More details to follow. If possible, it may be an outdoor service so more can attend.
- The stipend to be paid to Michelle Vogt as the Sunday School Superintendent is \$2500. It will be paid on a quarterly basis on a motion made by Scott Johnson and seconded by Adam Tyberendt. Motion carried.

Scott Johnson made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Adam Tyberendt seconded the motion. Motion carried. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Women's Fellowship

St. John UCC Women's Fellowship met on March 4, 2021 with 12 present. Jennifer Johnson opened the meeting. Pastor Poole gave the prayer.

The food drive designated for the Backpack Program is scheduled for April. The mission Team will provide Jennifer a list of desired items to be included in the bulletin and Visitor.

NEW BUSINESS:

The need for new confirmation robes was discussed. It was moved by Connie Turner and seconded by Michelle Coats to purchase twelve new confirmation robes for a cost of about \$248.

The decision to not have an Easter Egg hunt was made this year. Making and filling Easter baskets for children attending Easter morning service was discussed in lieu of. We are planning for about 75 children. It was moved by Joyce Kuergeleis and seconded by Ellen Edler to make the baskets and fill them with goodies. Motion carried. Various individuals offered to donate items to be included in the baskets: Ellen Edler-snacks, Anna Massa-plastic grass, Sandy Tutka-pencils and fruit snacks. Jennifer Johnson is ordering items to put in the plastic eggs, provided by Sunday School. It was decided to make the baskets on Monday, March 29 at 9 AM and for members to arrive at around 6 PM on April 1, our normal meeting date, to fill the baskets.

It was moved by Nancy Voelker and seconded by Patti Brandt to provide an allowance of up to \$125 to purchase food for vaccination clinic volunteers. Motion carried. Sharon Glessner will coordinate the date and items.

Pastor's report was primarily the message to encourage everyone to return to our sanctuary for Sunday morning services.

Birthdays for March included Pastor Poole and Jennifer Johnson.

Ellen Edler made a motion to adjourn and Michelle Coats seconded. Motion carried.

Our next meeting will be April 12th at 6:00pm to finalize what projects will be done at the work day on May 1.

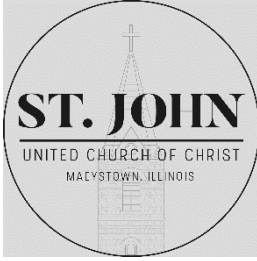
