Pastor's Reflection

Living Your Truth!

This past Saturday I had a gathering to celebrate the new grandbaby and we threw in to the mix Kyle's 29th B-day. This brought the aunts and uncles from both sides along with all our kids that could make it. It occurred to me that Kathy and I were the only two there that attended church and the only two that really took their faith seriously. Faith in this country has become so watered down that it has almost no true meaning. To say you're a Christian is more like a category to be checked on a form. How many people live their faith, and that among many things, means participating regularly in worship.

As I look around the room at my own beloved family, I see the absence of what you and I have. Being centered, grounded in a truth bigger than this time, even bigger than our own lives. The truth we live has been passed down to us through the scripture and traditions for thousands of years. The biblical narrative tells the story of the people's faith as they went through every kind of loss and hardship from wars, plagues, even the loss of their promise land. We also hear how God was with them, delivered them, saved them, guided them into a life of righteousness and joy. The lessons of grace, forgiveness, peace, joy, are not just lessons in a book but lived truths in our lives.

You are people of a practiced faith. Your principles and values stand out as does your grace and peace. Many of our members tend to tell it as it is and will fiercely defend what they know to be right. We call that principled. I can hear someone say, they got that from their dad and his dad before them, but it is more than that. It is their lived faith and that passion and stand for what is right is routed in the biblical lessons passed down for generations. Principled women and men standing up for what is right against all odds. We have members that have the gift of peace and see hope in almost every situation. They also are standing on the deep lessons passed down for generations and we see the power of the gospel brought to life.

My family looks to me for strength, guidance and hope but do not all follow me into the faith. How many of you have the same experience? I realized two important lessons. One, all of us that practice our faith are in the minority. In today's culture you are the odd ones, but you are also looked to when loved ones need support or guidance. When they truly need strength to get through something challenging in their lives you are who they call.

Secondly... and this is very important, I realized that I do not help the ones in my life to connect the dots. I do not tell them the qualities they see and seek in me are the result of my practiced faith, day in and day out, including Sunday mornings. That what they see and respond to is the presence of God in my heart and in my life. I don't tell them that for you and I there is nothing so precious to us than the peace we know from our walk with God and that walk and practiced traditions is our strength.

Romans 8:31-39

God's Love in Christ Jesus

31 What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? ³²He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? ³³Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. ³⁵Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ³⁶As it is written, 'For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.'

³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

These powerful words in scripture ring true for us and are visible in the way we live our lives. The ones we love can see it. I will not tell them all I just said in this reflection. I will simply say "What you see in me reflects my faith. The loving God that lives in my heart". Let's be ready next time someone asks "How do you manage all you're going through with so much peace"? "How do you find the courage to stand up for what is right"? "How do you have so much grace"? Be ready to share from your heart what God and your practiced faith means to you. When we tell our truth about what God is doing in our lives, it honors God and it honors the truth about who we are.

As I look out at our congregation, I see no two alike. You're not cookie cutter Christians. All of you have different gifts and different challenges and I am grateful for each one of you. I speak a lot of peace and love and that might not be the image you see yourself in. Trust me when I say, I would not change you for a minute. We do not need all our members to be grinning from ear to ear. We do not need all our member to never have a complaint. We do not need to share the same opinions. We come together to honor and worship God. We are Christians with a strength that comes from beyond ourselves. May we find new ways to authentically share our faith with the people in our lives.

Let us Live our Faith, our Truth together!

OLD BUSINESS

Vote on sound system and hooking up bell tower: Bids have been received from Audio Video Concepts from Columbia and Alobars Incorporated from St. Louis, Mo. The bid prices are relatively the same amount which

is near \$12,000. The equipment is different. Audio Video Concepts is bidding another system with 4 speakers like we have right now. Alobars Incorporated is bidding a system with a single speaker with 8 components. Alobars Incorporated is a small company who specializes mostly in churches, and schools. Drew Watts agreed to do some research about the single speaker with a company he knows through his work. We also requested a demonstration from Alobars on the 1 speaker system and asked church members to attend as well. The congregational meeting to vote on the system will be August 15, 2022 following church.

Parsonage Roof: The contract has been signed and checks issued. Work will be done when weather permits, hopefully July or August.

L-P Gas: No bids have been received as this time. Fluctuation of price may be a factor.

AED Machine: The motion to refurbish our existing AED machine for approximately \$300 was made by Drew Watts, seconded by Lisa Schwarze and it carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Come up with procedure as to what can be shared on the church's Facebook site and sold after church: The decision made was that postings are limited to our church organizations.

Lisa Schwarze made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Cheri Langsdorf seconded the motion. Motion carried. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.


