#### The Parable of the Mustard Seed.

#### Matthew 13:31-32

<sup>31</sup>He put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; <sup>32</sup>it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches."

The parable of the mustard seed was the gospel reading for this past Sunday. On its surface it makes a clear point that should not be lost.

The size of a mustard seed is so very small.



Yet it becomes such a large shrub/tree, "greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." In this parable Jesus is the one that sowed the seed. The tree is the gospel. The birds are you and in that find relief in the tree.

The first part of the message is clearly that something that starts out so small can grow exponentially. There was one, then twelve, and today billions of people following Christ. The Gospel has changed the world in countless ways and still transforms our lives today.

The second deeper look, not to take away from the overarching message of the first, is more challenging. The mustard plant consisted of two varieties. One, a vine and the other a shrub. Both were considered the worst of weeds at that time and would have been nearly impossible to get rid of as their root system joined together. No one would want this to grow in their field, no farmer would have planted the mustard seed in their field. The parable presents us with conundrums that force us to see what we cannot see otherwise. The un-welcomed shrub could be a reference to Jesus' ministry in the midst Jewish tradition. Jesus is an interruption, very much a weed in the minds of the pharisees. He would have been an interruption to the political system of his day. His ministry was a weed to those holding on to the statuesque.

Those sick with leprosy were outcast, seen as inflicted for theirs or their fathers' sins. Jesus healing them was crossing a line, they were to be untouchable. His healing them sent a powerful message that God heals even those as seen unworthy. Jesus fraternized the wicked tax collectors as well as prostitutes and brings them into salvation. Jesus through his messages called for the Jews to see their enemies as the good neighbor. As in the story of the Good Samaritan, the arch enemy of the Jews. Yes, Jesus would have most certainly been seen as a dangerous weed.

You can also take a more personal look, seeing the weeds in your life as new opportunities to see God working in your life. Seeing the weeds as challenges to be met in Christ. That even hardship can lead to a deeper walk with God. When a hardship meets the grace and power of being one in Christ, we become a reflection of Christ.

You see in few simple words Jesus takes us to a deep and rich place. The Kingdom of heaven is like of all things a mustard seed planted in the field that becomes a massive weed. What made no sense becomes the key to understanding and reimagining a new order, new life, new purpose, new power, new truth!

Can we see the manifestation of God in the most unlikely places and in the most unlikely faces? Can we see our enemies as family? Can we see the outcast as worthy of our time and care? Can we see our hardships as a part of life's journey that instead of separating us from the love of God brings us closer? If we can authentically challenge yourselves to allow the deeper meaning of the parable to change the way we see the weeds in our life, we will continue to grow into the Kingdom of Heaven.

The letter was given to the Coats' regarding the buildings currently being used by them, but is on church property. The letter has still not been returned to the council for notarization. It was noted that if the letter is not returned by the August council meeting, the church will not be responsible for any of the property stored in the buildings or injury to anyone using the buildings. The Coats would like to have their attorney look at the wording of the letter before signing and having it notarized. Sandy will encourage them to do so before the August council meeting.

A motion was made by Drew Watts and seconded by Lisa Schwarze to adjourn the meeting. The meeting closed with Pastor leading us in the Lord's Prayer.


