Piercing the Myth of Scarcity

Saturday, March 9th, I will be leading a workshop for the conference at the annual Day of Discipleship. This year is held at Camp DuBois. The title of the workshop is "Piercing the Myth of Scarcity." The inspiration for this workshop is all of you! In a world where churches are struggling, this congregation is growing in serving, loving, and participating in the great work of being church together. We are imperfect, and we have our ups and downs, but we cannot deny our many blessings and the gift of our many dedicated members.

Let's take a moment to acknowledge the challenge of living in a world where scarcity is the framework we all live. Not enough time, not enough money, not enough energy, not enough compassion, not enough grace, simply not enough and it is exhausting. Not enough is the background story of almost every challenge. The question posed in this workshop is "Is it true or a myth? Is it a story so old that it feels like the truth?" The world says we cannot because there is only so much to go around.

That is why churches make such a difference in the world. I am so proud of our little country church that says we can! When the Waterloo School Wellness Counselor came to a group of clergy in the Waterloo area and asked for help to feed the children who were going hungry over the weekends because the only reliable meals they were getting were from the school. You, collectively, with the leadership of your mission team said yes, we will not let the children go hungry. And the Back Pack Program was born. It now feeds 120 children every week, all year long, at an approximate cost of \$52,000 a year. This burden God quickly lifted off our shoulders with a very loving community that jumped in to help carry this program that has been running for over a decade. You also say "we can" when your members are in need; you give hundreds of dollars to our members who get caught in a bind. You also say "we can" when it comes time to support our youth attending college. The scholarship committee gives \$1000 to our youth who demonstrate a commitment to church and service. You say "we can" help when heart breaking circumstance hit families in our church and neighbors. The congregation gives thousands of dollars through the Fifth Sunday Offerings. When help is needed, you step up! The world of scarcity, never having enough, is not the drum we move to. The drum we move to is faith! Faith that when we step out to meet the needs of God's children, we find ourselves in the company of angels. What was seemingly impossible becomes possible.

The wellspring that feeds us, moves us, and renews us is living in the Spirit. It is our walking in faith that becomes our foundation and the truth that claims us.

Fifth Sunday Offering

Izabella is the recipient of this 5th Sunday Offering. She is the daughter of Michael & Megan DeSpain from Evansville and the granddaughter of Ron & Paulette Steiner. Isabella was having headaches and had an MRI and was diagnosed with an optic nerve glioma (tumor on her optic nerve). She was also having vision changes, and the doctor recommended that she see an oncologist for treatment with chemotherapy.

She started oral chemo in August and then three weeks later fell at school and broke her left upper arm. The broken arm healed in 8 weeks. She then developed sores on her toes and a whole body rash that would not go away with treatment and chemo had to be stopped to clear up her skin issues. She was hospitalized for 3 days because of the skin issues. MRI's have shown that chemo has been helpful with shrinking the tumor but the skin issues were getting too uncomfortable.

She also has been seeing a dermatologist. Izabella has missed a lot of school but has been positive and strong and thankful for the doctors giving her care.
