It's a Wonderful Life

It's a Wonderful Life is one of my favorite movies! Of course, George only realizes that truth after some powerful out-of-body experiences, as a miss-fit angle takes him through a series of eye-opening experiences. You and I, like George, can easily lose sight of how wonderful life truly is. George had Clarence, the inept angel. We have something better than Clarence, the Gospels. We learn the lessons Jesus taught us. In the movie, George loses sight of the privilege life is and the gift it is to share in the struggles and joys of living in a loving community. The scripture this past Sunday was one of those course-altering gospel messages if you take it to heart.

John 15:1-8

15"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.

At first glance, it may not be clear how closely this scripture relates to George's life crises. George's crises were derived from his circumstances and inability to see a way out. Life has a way of doing that in small and large ways. George was abiding in his crises and not in the divine. In other words, he was lost in the circumstances and not seeing the big picture of his life and God's hand in it. His goodness and the goodness of others were lost to him; he no longer had hope and was swallowed up, in a very dark place. In this movie, George is a great guy, someone you would never think would get so down. Which makes him so relevant in real life. If George could lose his way, so can we. However, like George, who wakes up to how rich and wonderful his life is, we too have that truth to wake up to.

The truth is always there if we seek it out. In other words, abide in, submit to, surrender to, and live for being one with Christ! Christ breathed the spirit into the disciples. That spirit is the breath of God that washed over our life, like the love of grandmother holding a precious child, neighbor helping neighbor, a community coming to the aid of a family in need. We live in this wonderful life and wonderful spirit as we abide by the divine truth that God has written in our hearts.

Let me put this another way: It would appear we should and need to manage our lives from a resource-given approach.
We have only so much time, money, energy, etc. That is the management of your life and not the being of your life. We
often put the management before the being in our life. The being of our life is the abiding part where we put our heart,
love, and commitment. We never want to lose sight of the being in our life for the doing of our life. The good news, the
most amazing news, is that when we are in the being of our life, the doing has a strange way of working itself out, and we
are so much richer for it. It is the difference between I have to (fill in the blanks) and I want to
because it is true to my being in the abiding love in my heart.

Love, then go and do, repeat a million times over. Love then do. Be in the abiding love of Christ, and then go and bring that love to life in your actions. It truly is a wonderful life, and I thank God for each and every one of you!

Church Council Minutes - March 11, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM by President Drew Watts. Pastor Poole opened the meeting with a prayer. Those in attendance were Drew Watts, Susan Koesterer, Fay Ross, Mark Rey, Cheri Langsdorf, Pam Muertz and Ron Richeson. Absent were Amy Rohlfing and Debbie Eckart.

Review/Approval of Minutes from February 12, 2024 Meeting

The minutes from the February meeting were reviewed. There being no changes or corrections a motion was made by Susan Koesterer and seconded by Cheri Langsdorf to accept the minutes. Motion carried.

Review/Approval of Treasurer's Report/Bills/Timecard/Pastor's Expenses

The treasurer's report/bills/timecard and Pastor's expenses were presented and reviewed. There being no changes or corrections, motion by Cheri Langsdorf, seconded by Fay Ross to accept reports as presented. Motion carried.

Council Members Reports

The council discussed two dead trees on the property. Drew will contact tree trimmers for estimate to remove the trees. The council discussed the need to select a recipient of the April 5th Sunday offering. Cheri will provide additional information regarding a potential recipient.

Solar Power Update

Pastor reported the loan application process should be wrapping up soon. Pastor also shared the need to select a project manager for the solar project. The council discussed potential church members who would be appropriate to lead the project. Pastor will reach out to see if they are willing to serve.

Fire Department Report

The Fire Department inspected all church building and provided a list of all deficiencies. Fay Ross will review the list of inadequacies and ensure actions are taken to remediate.

AED

The council discussed the difficulty to secure supplies for our existing AED machine. Additional research will occur to identify if another supplier is available for our current AED. A new AED would cost approximately \$1,500.

Student Pastor

Pastor reviewed a proposal to make Tim Burns a Student Pastor at St. John and Zion UCC. Pastor reviewed the student pastor responsibilities. Tim is currently in an online pastoral certificate program and active in the church ministry. The annual cost of the student pastor position is estimated at \$11,700 annually with St. John responsible for 2/3 of the cost and Zion responsible for 1/3. St. John has \$5,000 in the 2024 budget funded by donor to support the Student Pastor position.

A motion was made by Fay Ross to approve the proposal to add Tim Burns as a Student Pastor and seconded by Mark Rey. All in favor. Motion carried.

The council will hold an information meeting after church on April 28th to discuss the Student Pastor proposal. The congregational ballot vote to approve the Student Pastor will occur on May 19th.

More information regarding the Student Pastor responsibilities will be included in the Visitor.

Pastor's Report

Pastor reported that church attendance continues to be strong. Pastor also shared that beginning in April we will have music before church outside the church hall.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Cheri Langsdorf and seconded by Fay Ross to adjourn the meeting. Meeting adjourned. Pastor Poole closed the meeting by leading us in the Lord's Prayer.

STUDENT PASTOR

Description and responsibilities for the proposed St. John and Zion UCC Student Pastor position

- **Primary responsibilities**: Learn and grown in their gifts for ministry.
- **Secondary responsibilities**: Provided added support to the many missions, ministries, and programs of the church, congregation and community.

Participation in Ministry

- **Preaching**: Leading the Sunday worship service at least once every 6 weeks, as well as filling in for Pastor Poole when absent.
- Senior Programs and Ministries: Aiding with the existing programs as well as helping develop new ministries.
- Music Ministry: Special music for Sunday Worship Service as needed, sharing personal songs and their context with the Youth Group, as well as the seasonal outdoor performances held prior to the Sunday worship service outside the Church Hall.
- **Wednesday Warmup Program**: Continuing the existing Wednesday warmup program, as well as exploring other possible media ministries.
- Youth Ministries: Providing devotional messages at youth group meetings, as well as added support for the After School Program and all other youth events and ministry efforts.

Education

• Currently enrolled since August of 2023 in an online Pastoral Certificate Program provided through Phillips Theological Seminary Center for Ministry and Lay Training.

UCC Illinois South Conference

• As of February 2024, approved and accepted into the Conference as a Member in Discernment (Student-In-Care) pursuing licensed ministry.

Hours and Income

- Hours and income will be divided between St. John (2/3) and Zion (1/3) churches
- 15 hours a week at \$15 an hour, totaling \$11,700 yearly
- St. John responsible for \$7,800 (2/3) **\$5,000 currently in the budget for seminary student
- Zion responsible for \$3,900 (1/3)
